

GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGULATION INFORMATION

The purpose of the General Data Protection Regulation (**GDPR**) is to provide a set of standard data protection laws across the EU, making it easier for you to understand how your data is being used and to give you greater control over its use. It aims to keep your data **safe and private** making it easier for you to understand how your data is being used and to give you greater control over its use.

SBC undertakes to collect and use your personal data in compliance with the **GDPR**. We use this data for the administration of your membership, the communication of information and the organisation of events. We share your contact details with EBU, English Bridge Education & Development (**EBED**) and your **county of affiliation**; we provide a minimal amount of data for use by scoring programs to ensure that they correctly identify members. We may **occasionally** pass consented contact details to a *printing company* who print a membership directory for members.

Our **Privacy Policy** is where you can find full details of these matters including:

- What data we collect and what we use it for
- Where we get it from and to whom we give it
- What we do to ensure its security
- How you can see what data we hold about you and limit its use
- How you can ask for inaccuracies in data to be corrected
- Our legal reasons for collecting personal data

The organisation responsible for dealing with Data Protection across the UK is the **Information Commissioner's Office (ICO)** and they report directly to parliament. If you have concerns about our data protection you have the right to complain to the **ICO**. Find out on their website how to [report a concern](#). It has enforcement powers and can investigate compliance with data protection law.
